Mission

The Eamonn O'Loghlin Irish Canadian Immigration Centre, operating since 2012, assists diaspora from across the island of Ireland, offering outreach and information, nationally, in 3 key areas:

- 1. Immigration System Navigation
- 2. Employment Guidance and Resources
- 3. Social Services Navigation

Core Values

- **Trust:** leveraging and building on our reputation (Toronto Star Readers' Choice Awards 2020:Diamond Winner—Best Learning Centre)
- Awareness and Understanding: of the evolving needs of Irish diaspora
- Collaboration: with stakeholders across governments and communities

Unique Value Proposition

I/CAN's 3-pillared mandate, impacting across key social determinants of immigrant health (immigration status, employment status, access to healthcare and wellbeing services), decreases stress exposures for newcomers, facilitating a more manageable settlement experience.

I/CAN's outreach, especially for the vulnerable, supports more seamless transitions into Canadian society, developing more resilient and participatory newcomers, building a stronger society for all.

I/CAN's engagement of skilled volunteers bolsters local resources by plugging gaps in community services. In doing so, it promotes social inclusion, fosters unity and mutual understanding, and sets an example—particularly for young service users—of the value of volunteering, helping to cultivate the next generation of civic-minded citizens: "I would welcome the opportunity to pay forward the assistance and support I received."

Key Outcomes of Our Work

I/CAN clients:

- are more aware of resources available to them upon entry and while they are settling, reducing vulnerability.
- have better knowledge of immigration processes, troubleshooting next steps in a timely manner, lessening uncertainty.
- participate in local labour markets, broader communities, and social networks, strengthening their potential for advancement and wellbeing in Canada.

Service Coverage

We provide support:

- across all 10 provinces (and occasionally in one of the 3 territories!)
- in 6 Canadian time zones
- and we even take calls from across the island of Ireland—families often reach out, concerned about loved ones in Canada.

Facilitated by:

- 3 full-time team members
- 1 micro part-time team member

Message from the Executive Director

This year was defined by innovation and an unwavering commitment to address complex issues.

After extensive envisioning, we launched our online Legal Clinic—a long-standing goal, now fully realised. Delivered entirely virtually, the clinic ensures that individuals, no matter where they live—from remote communities to major cities—can access legal support at no cost. In doing so, it helps dismantle longstanding barriers to essential legal services.

Recognising that some clients require personalised support while others need only the right tools, we overhauled our website to make it more intuitive and accessible. Clients can access resources and self-help guides around the clock. The site has evolved from a communications platform into a core component of our service model.

We also reimagined our opioid outreach campaign, adopting a bolder approach to address a crisis that demands urgency and clarity. Our commitment to vulnerable communities deepened with the launch of our Out of Status campaign. Grounded in compassion, this initiative offers resources and support to help individuals navigate uncertain circumstances with dignity and hope.

Another key development was the relaunch of our Immigration Fraud Prevention campaign, reaffirming our dedication to protecting those most at risk of exploitation.

Each year, we receive unsolicited messages from clients that speak to the impact of our small but highly effective team. When a client takes the time to say thank you, it affirms that our work matters. I am deeply grateful to our team for their dedication, steadfast focus, and the tangible results they deliver every day.







I moved to Montreal in January 2025, after my wife Rebecca had been working in Canada since the winter of 2023. Having spent several weeks exploring the city in 2024, I was thrilled to finally make the move full-time. Still, I was a little nervous as I do not speak French, and I wasn't sure what my employment prospects would look like.

Before leaving Ireland, I attended the I/CAN employment webinar, which provided excellent tips and advice. I'd highly recommend it to anyone job-hunting here. I was fortunate to find a position in my field just six weeks after arriving in Montreal, and even luckier that it's remote, meaning I don't need to be bilingual.

That said, I'm currently taking the free government French classes a couple of evenings a week. I think it's important to embrace the local language and culture and Montreal is a bilingual city.

The I/CAN socials and website are fantastic resources for newcomers, and Rhonda from I/CAN was incredibly generous in sharing information with me. My wife and I are loving life in Montreal, and we're always happy to connect with fellow Irish living in the city.

We moved to Toronto in June 2011, after spending two years working in Jamaica. Originally from Dublin, my wife Sarah and I arrived with our nearly two-year-old daughter Tess, ready to start a new chapter. Moving to Canada is a wonderful experience, but not without challenges – comparison to home, visa requirements and cost are the very real issues that make or break a move.

I joined Rogers Communications over 12 years ago and am still there today. Since then, our family has grown—we're now four, with our son Olly, now 12, born in Toronto—and we bought a home in Greektown about six years ago. Sarah launched her own PR agency, Agnostic Inc., five years back and now employs 25 people.

While getting established here was a challenge in the early days, it gradually became easier. One key to settling in was committing emotionally to our new home. You can't have one foot on the plane to Ireland – wherever you are, you need to be there. We became Canadian citizens two years ago and truly enjoy our life in Toronto— though our kids consider Ireland their home too.


